Course Description: Arranging and analyzing musical scores. (This course will explore all families of instruments, their ranges and timbres. Students will gain experience in arranging, idiomatic notation, score/part preparation, and increase their familiarity with the standard orchestra and band literature.)

Prerequisite: Passing grade in MU222 (Theory IV)

Required Textbook: Kennan and Grantham, *The Technique of Orchestration*, 6th ed. (Book Only).

The project must be done in computer notation, and will be graded with these criteria in mind:

• Proper key signatures, clefs, time signatures, and transposition

- Proper instrument ranges and idiomatic writing
- Metronome markings, dynamics, expressions and articulations
- Instrument balance
- Performance and practicality

Attendance is required, an excused absence consists of notifying the instructor by telephone or written note before the start of the class. A note from the doctor will also be accepted the following class period. The classroom door will be locked after 5 minutes, please be on time. The maximum absences that can be accumulated (excused or unexcused) is 6. More then 6 absences (excused or unexcused) will result in a failing grade of F. If you know that you be unable to attend classes because of University obligations, (i.e., Choir, Band, Athletics, etc...) save your absences. In addition, do not count on a coach, director, teacher, etc... to send out a memo excusing you from class.
